Ambrosio DaCunha Asqueli (Tony) is a Timorese seasonal worker employed by MADEC and works at Bon Accord, Lindenow. He has had several trips to Australia, some might remember him when he was a resident at the Salesian House. Several months ago Tony was feeling unwell and approached a couple of parishioners who immediately guided him with medical assistance. After many doctors' appointments and tests, Tony is beginning a 5 week regime of radiation and chemotherapy. He will be staying at Centenary House, Traralgon Monday to Friday. A team of drivers will take him to Traralgon on Monday and pick him up on Friday. Another team of cooks will prepare his main meals in advance, so he arrives with a week's supply of food suitable for his stoma and chemotherapy. During this period Tony will not be able to work, however he still has ongoing daily living costs to deal with so with a small balance leftover from the Bairnsdale Friends of Timor Leste and generous donations, the Parish Support Team has also decided to support him with a small weekly payment. Tony is very grateful for all the support he is receiving, particularly from Frank Brown Graham, Bairnsdale Regional Health, Cabrini Hospital, fellow seasonal workers and parishioners. EASING OF RESTRICTIONS

Fears for safety and health of detainees in Melbourne's Park Hotel

Over half of the detainees in Melbourne's Park Hotel APOD have tested positive to COVID-19.

As of 7 November, the 22 men who have contracted the virus have been ordered to stay within their rooms and isolate. There are reports that despite detainees testing positive, **few of them have been assessed by a doctor** and there has only been one nurse to care for the 45 men in detention.

One detainee, who was sent to a Melbourne hospital to be treated for his worsening condition after contracting COVID19, **has now been sent back to the Park Hotel** despite the worsening outbreak there.

Over 200 organisations and individuals have signed a letter coordinated by [Love Makes A Way](#), demanding that the Federal Government address the health crisis in immigration detention and urgently release all detainees to safety in the community.

3rd Sunday of Advent, Year C

Entrance Antiphon

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near.

A reading from the prophet Zephaniah (3:14-18)

Shout for joy, daughter of Zion, Israel, shout aloud! Rejoice, exult with all your heart, daughter of Jerusalem! The Lord has repealed your sentence; he has driven your enemies away. The Lord, the king of Israel, is in your midst; you have no more evil to fear. When that day comes, word will come to Jerusalem: Zion, have no fear, do not let your hands fall limp. The Lord your God is in your midst, a victorious warrior. He will exult with joy over you, he will renew you by his love; he will dance with shouts of joy for you as on a day of festival.

Responsorial Psalm

R. Cry out with joy and gladness: for among you is the great and Holy One of Israel.

Truly, God is my salvation, I trust, I shall not fear.

For the Lord is my strength, my song, he became my saviour.

With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation **R.**

Give thanks to the Lord, give praise to his name! Make his mighty deeds known to the peoples!

Declare the greatness of his name. **R.**

Sing a psalm to the Lord for he has done glorious deeds, make them known to all the earth!

People of Zion, sing and shout for joy for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel. **R.**

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Philippians (4:4-7)

I want you to be happy, always happy in the Lord; I repeat, what I want is your happiness. Let your tolerance be evident to everyone: the Lord is very near. There is no need to worry; but if there is anything you need, pray for it, asking God for it with prayer and thanksgiving, and that peace of God, which is so much greater than we can understand, will guard your hearts and your thoughts, in Christ Jesus.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, Alleluia!

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me; he sent me to bring Good News to the poor.

Alleluia!

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke (3:10-18)

When all the people asked John. 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same.' There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!' A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.

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Scripture Notes

Christianity is a very social and practical religion. It is one of words and deeds. It is not just a matter of God and me, but of God, others and me. In other words, it concerns not only my relationship with God, but also my relationship with other people. John the Baptist has been telling the people that the Messiah is coming, and that they should prepare themselves. The people came to John for baptism, but they knew that more was expected. So, they asked him, 'What must we do?' He gave them some very down to earth advice. To the everyday person he said: those who are well off must share with those who are not well off. To tax collectors he said: don't exact more than your rate i.e. don't use your office to exploit people. To soldiers he said: don't use your power to intimidate or oppress people. In essence he was saying: show concern for others and be just in all your dealings. That is how practical Christianity is. Christianity lives by deeds but dies by words alone.
